WHY?

Rape and pillage of HIV community by academic researchers

WHEN?

From 2003 to present- the evolution

CBR tools evaluation and CBR “network enhancement” proposal

CIHR Objectives for CBRF Project

Objective 1: To develop and enhance community-based research capacity among Aboriginal and non-Aboriginal community representatives and researchers from both the academic and non-academic settings

Objective 2: To facilitate the development of partnerships between community organizations and researchers and the engagement of affected communities in HIV/AIDS community-based research

Objective 3: To improve the skills of community organizations in designing community-based research projects
